




Purple Passion Project


and clicking our online giving button or using the "giving" option in our Church app. Your gifts are an investment in the spiritual lives of our teens, and we greatly appreciate your generosity.



If you are planning on attending our services please remember the following:

- Masks are required at all times.
- Temperatures will be taken at check-in.
- Social distancing is being enforced per CDC recommendations.

- If you are feverish or not feeling well, we ask that you stay home and join us online on our Facebook and YouTube channels.

With time constraints and necessary lighting changes for our live feed, we do ask everyone to take a seat directly after you check in for your safety.




