Purple Passion Project



Valerie's House Update

On the 1st and 3rd Monday night of each month our church hosts Valerie's House. This is a unique Grief Program for kids ages 4 - 18 who have recently lost a parent. Currently we have 6 small groups meeting serving approximately 21 Charlotte County families. Any given week we will have 30 or more children and often their caregiver(s) attendance at the meetings. This is such a blessing for these children and their caregivers to be able to learn more about their



grief and share with others who have also experienced this type of loss.

We want to thank the dozen so facilitators and mentors who regularly help us run this program. We want to thank you, the members of 1st church, for partnering with Valerie's House to use 6 classrooms for small groups, along with the gym and playground for this vital program. We also want to thank all of you who have donated teddy bears for these children, they love them!! We are now asking for journals to be donated. We want each of our grieving children to be

able to use journals as a way to express their grief and record some of the daily struggles. This tool will help them immensely as they begin to process these new and challenging emotions they face on a daily basis. Consider purchasing a journal of any kind and placing it in the Valerie's House Teddy Bear box located in Lenox Hall by the missions bulletin board. Word from Worship

Greetings 1st Church --

Hard to believe that Easter Sunday is about 2 weeks away! Even though it's a very busy time at church, I am happy with all the planning, setting up, scheduling volunteer help, etc etc, when I remember the situation during last year's Lenten and Easter season. Do you remember? No services! No Easter Sunrise, or formal in-church worship of any kind. Only a world wide pandemic could do that! It was however, the beginning of our online worship-- which has grown tremendously in the past year. We have been blessed in spite of the roadblocks we've had to overcome. God is so good!

Things have had to change somewhat; no services in the sanctuary, no sitting close to each other, no hugs, and no doughnuts in Fellowship Hall. We no longer take attendance by signing in the "black attendance books". As you've experienced, we have volunteers signing you in when you arrive, on laptops. I realize that sometimes the computer is "slow " - or there is a lineup of people - though we try very hard to keep things moving as quickly as possible so you can be seated. You can help this process by preregistering before you arrive. Then it's a quick temperature check and no delay. Name tags also help us to get the correct spelling of names. We thank you for your patience and cooperation.

We've all been uplifted by Pastor Mike and Bob's messages about prayer. Our RPM prayer team has been sharing ideas on effective prayer. Everyone has different situations, but today we discussed setting up a special place to pray, like a closet, small room or a large living area if you have it. More importantly, we've talked about things that can keep us from prayer time. Sometimes it's physical problems/pain, or even busyness. Maybe we think God might not be listening. But God is waiting for us. Whether we're in a small closet, walking in the woods, or sitting in a chair in your living room, God is waiting. Let His love wash over you. You can come as you are. No matter what's happening in your life, pray with humility, asking God for His mercy. Colossians 4:2 : Devote yourself to prayer with an alert mind and a thankful heart.



The Eighth Note – Music Ministry in a Minute!

Greetings Everyone,

Happy St. Patrick's Day!

St. Patrick was a fifth century Christian Missionary and Bishop in Ireland who is credited with bring Christianity to the Irish. At the age of sixteen, he was captured by Irish pirates and forced into to slavery in Ireland for six years before he was able



to escape. After arriving home, he was educated and ordained into the priesthood. He felt called to return to Ireland as a Christian Missionary, where he established over 300 churches and converted many to the Christian Faith. St. Patrick is credited with using the three leafed shamrock to teach the Irish the doctrine of the Holy Trinity.

Here is a hymn attributed to St. Patrick:

I Bind Unto Myself Today

I bind unto myself today the strong name of the Trinity by invocation of the same, the Three in One and One in Three.

I bind this day to me forever, by power of faith, Christ's incarnation, his baptism in the Jordan river, his death on the cross for my salvation, his bursting from the spiced tomb, his riding up the heavenly way, his coming at the day of doom, I bind unto myself today.

I bind unto myself today the power of God to hold and lead, God's eye to watch, God's might to stay, God's ear to hearken to my need, the wisdom of my God to teach, God's hand to guide, God's shield to ward, the word of God to give me speech, God's heavenly host to be my guard.

Christ be with me, Christ within me, Christ behind me, Christ before me, Christ beside me, Christ to win me, Christ to comfort and restore me. Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ in quiet, Christ in danger, Christ in hearts of all that love me, Christ in mouth of friend and stranger.

I bind unto myself the name, The strong name of the Trinity By invocation of the same, The Three in One and One in Three. Of whom all nature has creation, Eternal Father, Spirit, Word. Praise to the Lord of my salvation; Salvation is of Christ the Lord! AMEN.

Get Connected!




